

RV Awning Sun Shade

Purchased a 20' x 8' sunscreen and (16) universal awning hooks from Amazon.com for around \$120.00, then went to Camping World and purchased a set of awning holddown's for another \$15.00, next we went to Home Depot and purchased two lengths of PVC pipe that would fit into each other and two 3/8 inch bolts for another \$20. (Totaling a \$155.00)

Once assembled this screen spans the entire length of our awning, with the extra awning hooks and spiral stakes, plus the upright columns we have a homemade awning shades system that can withstand a considerable wind.

This modification allows us to sit outside with direct sunlight comfortably; it also reduces the heat on the refrigerator side of the Motorhome and shields us somewhat from the wind.

The only drawback is that the two interlocking PVC pipes used as the support columns have to be re-drilled for the 3/8 inch bolt depending on the ground level, but it's well worth the convenience of sitting in a semi-shaded area.
